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1. History and Geography

1.1 Quick history of the city and the economy of Blumenau

Blumenau was founded on September, 2nd 1850. The first 17 settlers came here to establish an agricultural colony on the land acquired by the German philosopher Hermann Bruno Otto Blumenau with the Provincial Government. It became Distrito da Paz (District of Peace) in 1858; a county in February 1880 and finally a city in 1894.

In a few decades Blumenau developed a diversified economy, became strongly active in textile and clothing segments, leaving the agriculture production as the main characteristic. Also it is known as garden city, it is located in the green valley of Itajaí, in a mountainous region, divided by the river Itajaí, with temperate and humid weather, with average temperature of 21C. It is very hot in the summer but nice weather the rest of the year. The average altitude is 14 meters and the wind blows from the East quadrant.

The main access are: BR -470 which connects the East to the West of the city, road to get to Luis Alves, Navegantes, Itajaí and BR -101, in the East; in the West, it connects Pomerode, Indaial, Timbó and other cities of the Itajaí Valley. The SC -470 (Jorge Lacerda road) connects Blumenau to Gaspar, Ilhota, Itajaí, BR -101; SC -474 (Guilherme Jensen road) connects Blumenau to Massaranduba, Guaramirim and Jaraguá do Sul.

The number of people reaches 338.876 inhabitants (IBGE 2015). It is characterized by the textile industry synthesized by Hering company, by many Hunting and Shooting Clubs, by the Oktoberfest, by the crystals, by the beautiful gardens and big natural parks, by the the first TV channel in the State (Coligadas), by the amateur sport, by the tourism and by the enxaimel style of constructions. The city is a reference for the software programming, as much as for the culinary, for the diversified commerce, for health care and transplants, for the educational system and for its people, that, with the mixing of races, we have always raised willpower and positive support to face difficulties and also to build a modern, lively city and full of life quality.
